Sucker River H-58 bridge replacement and seasonal Sea Lamprey barrier Public Scoping Meeting

You are invited to a Public Scoping Meeting to learn about and provide feedback on a proposed project in the Sucker River near Grand Marais, MI. The Great Lakes Fishery Commission, U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service, Michigan Department of Natural Resources, and other local partners are proposing a two-stage project to improve stream health and connectivity, and address sea lamprey infestation in a difficult to control stream.



Replacing the H-58 culvert with a free span bridge and constructing a seasonal sea lamprey barrier further upstream in the watershed would provide for increased movement of non-jumping fish species further upstream and reduce the stream distance exposed to lampricides used to control invasive sea lamprey, while also addressing stream bank erosion. A free span bridge will provide all species access to an additional 20 miles of habitat year-round, and 115 miles seasonally.
